Session 2 - Local asset mapping

Understanding the strengths within your community – The facilitator will work with the group to look at how specific strengths and aspirations are identified within communities, and how this interacts with a community's resilience, looking at:

- Recognising existing strengths and skills within your community and their to potential to build community resilience
- How to identify, map and understand your community assets

Community engagement – the focus of this part of the session will be to understand how to amplify community engagement and its potential to grow resilience, including:

- The recruitment, coordination, and retention of volunteers
- How to leverage the skills, knowledge & connections of others, e.g. Council for Voluntary Service (CVS)
 organisations

Session 3 - What volunteers can / could /can't do

Roles and responsibilities in the event of emergencies – the facilitator will talk about the roles of different agencies including the local authority. This will cover:

- An overview of responsibilities and potential roles within the context of emergency planning, response and recovery
- How this fits within the context of the UK Government's National Resilience Framework
- Where communities can seek information and support (input from participants)

How can communities contribute to building resilience and responding to emergencies

- What roles can community members and volunteers have in building resilience and responding to emergencies
- Examples of the role non-government agencies can play (potential guest speakers/case studies)
- Case studies that demonstrate the value of community resilience
