A QAVS is often described as the MBE for voluntary groups, this award was created by the Queen in 2002 in celebrating her Golden Jubilee. Recipients are announced each year on the anniversary of the Queen's Coronation, 2nd June. It is considered the most prestigious award for voluntary groups; those awarded receive a beautiful crystal and certificate; they are also allowed to use the QAVS logo on their website, stationery etc.



The Award aims to recognise outstanding work by volunteer groups for the benefit of their local communities and is a wonderful accolade for largely unsung heroes. Most of those living in Shropshire know they live in a beautiful place. Our county is made all the more beautiful by the joint endeavours of people trying to make it better still, for individuals, for their communities and for society as a whole. We are keen to reach more voluntary sector organisations to reward the work they do, year in, year out. You do not have to be a registered charity, any organisation with three or more volunteers, can be nominated.
