#### Introduction

This survey has been developed in partnership by the Shropshire Association of Local Councils (SALC) and the organisations which support the voluntary and community sector in both Shropshire and Telford, these being the Shropshire Voluntary and Community Sector Assembly (VCSA) and the Telford Chief Officers Group (Telford COG).
